25 thread per inch evenweave fabric.

The V&A has only one black and white photo to work from, because of this, the colors are unknown. The ones shown indicate areas of light and dark acurately, but are otherwise conjectural.

The offical description labels this as tent/cushion stitch. However, looking at the photo this is definately brick stitch as shown.
